

Directory Art without and with d64nice

Original upper case

Directory Art with „normal“ bars (Shift+B and Shift+C) upper case (standard)



Original lower case

Directory Art with „normal“ bars (Shift+B and Shift+C) lower case (not standard) → looks not nice



With d64nice lower case

Same Directory Art as above, but d64 nice used (no Shift+B and Shift+C anymore) lower case (standard) → you see no difference yet



With d64nice upper case

Same Directory Art as original, but d64 nice used (no Shift+B and Shift+C anymore) upper case (non standard) → you see a difference to the original now; the frame looks great, the logo looks at least a little bit better



Usage

d64nice is a windows command line tool and can therefor be used within cmd as follows:

```
d64nice.exe <source file> <destination file>
```

```
< source file> ... File that shall be made nicer.
```

```
< destination file> .. Nice file, that will be created by the tool.
```
